## Pastor Endorsements of Political Candidates

Survey of Protestant Pastors



#### Methodology


- The phone survey of Protestant pastors was conducted August 22 – September 16, 2016
- The calling list was a stratified random sample, drawn from a list of all Protestant churches. Quotas were used for church size
- Each interview was conducted with the senior pastor, minister or priest of the church called
- Responses were weighted by region to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,000 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed +3.2%
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups




# 98% of pastors say they have not publicly endorsed a candidate during a church service this year






# 77% of pastors say they have not personally endorsed candidates this year outside of their church role

#### Significant Statistical Differences

□ Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among the church's attendance and region, the pastor's age and ethnicity.

| Attendance | Region    | Age   | Pastor's<br>Ethnicity |
|------------|-----------|-------|-----------------------|
| 0-49       | Northeast | 18-44 | White                 |
| 50-99      | Midwest   | 45-54 | African<br>American   |
| 100-249    | South     | 55-64 | Other<br>Ethnicities  |

#### Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were also made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among the selfidentified Evangelical or Mainline, denomination, and education level.

#### Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were also made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among presidential candidate and political party.

### "Have you publicly endorsed candidates for public office during a church service this year?"

- Pastors of churches with attendance of 50-99 are the most likely to select "No" (>99%)
- Pastors of Other Ethnicities (6%) are more likely to select "Yes" than White pastors (1%)
- Evangelical pastors (2%) are more likely to select "Yes" than Mainline pastors (<1%)</li>
- Pastors voting for Donald Trump (3%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those who are Undecided (1%)



#### "Have you personally endorsed candidates for public office this year outside of your church role?"

- Pastors of churches with attendance of 0-49 (28%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those with attendance of 50-99 (20%)
- Pastors age 65+ are the most likely to select "Yes" (34%), while those age 18-44 are least likely (11%)
- African-American pastors (28%) are more likely to select "Yes" than pastors of Other Ethnicities (12%)
- Mainline pastors (81%) are more likely to select "No" than Evangelical pastors (75%)
- Pastors voting for Donald Trump (38%) are more likely to select "Yes" than those voting for Hillary Clinton (20%) or who are Undecided (12%)
- Republicans (26%) are more likely to select "Yes" than Independents (17%)
