Survey of Protestant Pastors



Methodology


- The phone survey of 1,000 Protestant pastors was conducted August 29 – September 11, 2018
- The calling list was a stratified random sample, drawn from a list of all Protestant churches. Quotas were used for church size
- Each interview was conducted with the senior pastor, minister or priest of the church called
- Responses were weighted by region to more accurately reflect the population
- The completed sample is 1,000 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed <u>+</u>3.2%
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups

Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among the church's attendance and region, the pastor's gender, age and ethnicity.

Significant Statistical Differences

Comparisons were also made to determine if there are any significant statistical differences among education level, the self-identified Evangelical or Mainline, and denomination.

"Overall, how would you rate the job performance of President Trump?"

- Pastors of churches with attendance of 0-49 are the least likely to Approve (42%)
- Pastors in the South (55%) and West (57%) are more likely to Approve than those in the Northeast (40%)
- Males pastors are more likely to Approve than Females (56% v. 30%)
- Pastors age 18-44 are least likely to Approve (41%)
- Pastors age 18-44 are more likely to be Not Sure (25%) than pastors age 55-64 (18%) and 65+ (16%)
- African-American pastors are the least likely to Approve (4%) and most likely to Disapprove (85%)
- Pastors with no college degree (71%) or a Bachelor's degree (67%) are more likely to Approve than those with a Master's degree (41%) or a Doctoral degree (52%)



"Overall, how would you rate the job performance of President Trump?"

- Evangelical pastors are more likely to Approve than Mainline pastors (63% v. 41%)
- Pentecostals are most likely to approve (86%), followed by Baptists (68%)
- Lutherans (41%) and Christian/COC (55%) are more likely to approve than Presbyterian/Reformed (28%) and Methodists (25%)



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
