Methodology


- The online survey of 1,019 Americans was conducted March 22 April 2, 2019
- The project was sponsored by The Philos Project
- Respondents were invited to participate from a large national panel
- Respondents were screened to only include self-identified Black or African Americans who were born in the U.S.
- Maximum quotas and slight weights were used for gender, region, age, education, and religious group to more accurately reflect the African American population using statistics published by Pew Research and the Census Bureau
- The completed sample is 1,019 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed +3.6%
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups


"From which of the following sources do you regularly get news?"





"From which of the following TV networks do you regularly get news?"























"Which of the following have influenced your opinions about Israel?"






34% say the media has most influenced their views about Israel, 17% say the Bible, and 26% are not sure















"Which, if any, of the following have positively influenced your opinions about the country of Israel today?"
































28% agree they are seeing more black people express anti-Semitism than in the past
























Christian Church attendance of participants





- Catholics (60%) are more likely to Agree than Other Religions (34%) or Nonreligious (42%)

- Males are more likely to Agree than Females (37% v. 24%)
- Those in the Northeast are the most likely to Agree (39%)
- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to Agree (38%)
- Catholics (43%) are more likely to Agree than Other Protestants (28%)



The state of Israel has given Palestinians control of too much land within the country of Israel

- Those age 18-34 are the most likely to Agree (34%)
- Catholics (50%) are more likely to Agree than Historically Black Protestants (26%), Other Protestants (24%), or Nonreligious (17%)



The state of Israel has laws that specifically discriminate against the Palestinians people

- Males are more likely to Agree than Females (46% v. 36%)
- Those in the Northeast (45%) and Midwest (45%) are more likely to Agree than those in the West (30%)
- Those with a Graduate degree (50%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (38%)
- Nonreligious (47%) are more likely to Agree than Other Protestants (38%)



Americans should boycott, divest from and sanction Israel for its treatment of Palestinians

Martin Luther King, Jr., was a strong supporter of the Jewish people

- Males are more likely to Agree than Females (54% v. 44%)
- Those age 65+ (57%) are more likely to Agree than those 35-49 (44%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (57%) are more likely to Agree than those with some college (46%) or with a Graduate Degree (43%)
- Historically Black Protestants (72%) are more likely to Agree than Other Protestants (47%), Other Religions (48%), or Nonreligious (44%)



Jewish people in America were instrumental to advances made in the Civil Rights Movement

- Males are more likely to Agree than Females (50% v. 37%)
- Those age 65+ are the most likely to Agree (53%)
- Those with a Bachelor's Degree (52%) or with a Graduate Degree (53%) are more likely to Agree than those who are High School Graduates or less (39%)
- Historically Black Protestants (57%) are more likely to Agree than Other Protestants (41%)



Martin Luther King, Jr., was a strong supporter of Israel

- Males are more likely to Agree than Females (47% v. 37%)
- Those age 65+ (50%) are more likely to Agree than those 18-34 (40%)
- Nonreligious are the least likely to Agree (32%)



The formation of modern Israel is a fulfillment of God's covenant with the Jewish people

- Those who are High School Graduates or less (29%) are more likely to select "Make me more aligned with the Black Lives Matter movement" than those with some college (17%) or a Graduate Degree (15%)
- Catholics (42%) are more likely to select "Make me more aligned with the Black Lives Matter movement" than Historically Black Protestants (18%), Other Protestants (21%), or Nonreligious (22%)

- Catholics (44%) are more likely to select "Yes" than Nonreligious (27%)
